SUBJECT: Accepting Applications for the Hawaii Science Item Authoring Workshop

The Assessment Section of the Office of Strategy, Innovation and Performance, in partnership with Cambium Assessment Inc. (CAI), is offering a face-to-face workshop for science teachers to become item (i.e., test question) authors for the Hawaii Statewide Assessment Program. Teachers who are interested in learning how test questions are developed, and how alignment to the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) is ensured, are encouraged to apply. Items being developed will be included in the Checkpoint system for use in developing standards-aligned, teacher generated tests.

This workshop is part of an ongoing effort to support educator assessment literacy. Participants will gain a deeper appreciation of the components of quality assessments by learning how to develop items that are aligned to the NGSS. Participants will receive instruction on content and item/task specifications, practical training in developing assessment items for classroom use, and participate in collegial discussion of assessment targets based on the NGSS performance expectations.

QUALIFICATIONS

Qualified educators include certificated elementary, middle, and high school teachers who are providing science instruction to students. Applicants should have a deep understanding of the NGSS for the grade level(s) taught.

This training is focused on fundamental item authoring skills; therefore, it is intended for educators who are interested in improving their item authoring skills by collaborating with novice item. Participants will work in groups by grade band (e.g., grade bands 3-5, 6-8, and high school) so a willingness to collaborate and provide constructive feedback is expected of all participants.

Participants will be compensated with a stipend of \$184.66 per day. In lieu of a stipend, the cost of substitute teachers will be provided for participants who will need one.

This training will be in-person at the CAI's Honolulu Office located at 1601 Kapiolani Boulevard, Suite 900.

PARTICIPANT TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

All participants will need to bring a computer or mobile device that can connect to the internet wirelessly.

SPECIAL NOTES

- Participants must be able to serve on all four (4) days that have been scheduled for the workshop.
- For neighbor island committee members, CAI will make all travel arrangements, including air transportation, ground transportation, and hotel accommodations. CAI will reimburse participants for parking fees at their home airports. CAI will not honor travel coupons or reimburse participants who make their own travel arrangements.
- For Oahu committee members, CAI will provide validated parking at the meeting site. CAI or the Department will not reimburse participants for mileage or gas.
